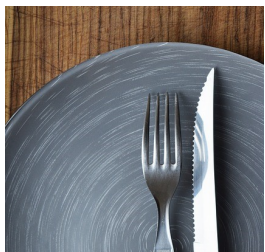

Thursdays, October 4th and 18th from 6:00 PM to 7:30 PM

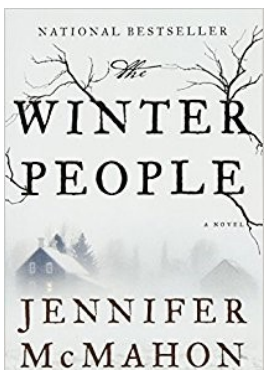
Join members from the Finger Lakes Mindfulness Meditation Group for free, open meditation for meditators of all levels. *No registration.*

Guitar Concert: Alex Lassa

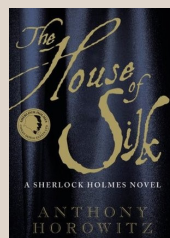
Saturday, October 27th at 7:30 PM - Library Hall (upstairs)
